



'In November of 2012 BCCCPA will mark its 10th year since it was founded by a group of parents of children with cancer. Through those years we have worked closely with the Oncology/Hematology and Bone Marrow Transplant Program at BC Children's Hospital (BCCH) to develop relevant and meaningful activities and support for children with cancer or blood disorders and their families.

BCCCPA identified 'Family Financial Aid' as an important component of helping a child/youth and family navigate the challenges of a cancer or blood disorder diagnosis. In 2011, we were able to assist 54 families with financial help, raising \$157,000 with nearly 90% going for 'charitable giving' to families.

Other programs offering respite and relaxation have included 'Date Nights' for parents; outreach to survivors and parents on Vancouver and the Gulf Islands by supporting a Patient/Parent

Advocate position and outreach programming for the Victoria General Hospital's pediatric Oncology program. BCCCPA's outreach and involvement includes the funding of parent and family retreats, while also supporting cancer research. We're currently investigating possible recipients/researchers for funds that have been set aside for pediatric cancer research. A new program/service initiated about 4 months ago is known as 'Food for Thought.' This involves bringing 'home cooked meals' for all of the children and family members in the BCCH oncology in-patient areas.

BCCCPA has several friends and donors in many communities across British Columbia. It is because of these partnerships and relationships that we are able to do so much with so little. While we're a small grassroots charity compared to most, we are transparent and accountable. BCCCPA welcomes the opportunity to join with you in ways that we can continue to support and cooperate in childhood cancer control. Many of our initiatives involve improving the quality of life for children and youth with cancer and their families.

It is my definite privilege and honor to be a part of BCCCPA and all that it encompasses.

Making a difference even in a small way is what I believe it is all about. We hope you agree because,


A Shining Example ~ Foresters helps inspire a boy to keep giving back.

Community service and volunteerism are two of the most important elements Foresters Membership provides, and the Tardi family embraces these opportunities as often as possible. Over the past 13 years the Tardis have attended many Foresters events - but it's their volunteer efforts that seem to have had the greatest impact on their young sons. Committed to giving back to their community, the family has volunteered for many Foresters activities, including Christmas Toy Workshops where they helped to build toys for sick children.

Volunteering has truly become a lifestyle for the Tardis. And giving back is 2nd nature to their boys.

Jordan Tardi, a grade-9 student, recently raised \$701.51 that he has donated to the British Columbia Childhood Cancer Parents Association (BCCCPA) in memory of Quinn Dunbar, a boy who passed away from cancer in 2008. The BCCCPA helps families who have children with cancer and who are struggling financially by providing them with financial aid. Jordan raised the money by setting up a haunted house in his garage, and he has since been nominated by his teacher and vice-principal for a Surrey Youth

Recognition Award for community spirit.

Research Funding – BCCCPA's \$10,000 donation to the BC Genome Sciences Centre & more Research Project Funding to be announced in 2012!

One of BCCCPA's mandates is to advocate for (and fund) research into childhood cancer discoveries, treatments and cures. As parents of children with cancer, we see value in research that is making a difference, as do you - our donors and readers.

BCCCPA's first major contribution was to the BC Genome Sciences Centre (BCGSC) of \$10,000.00 that was matched by a "mirror" donor for a total of \$20,000.00 - this, and a major contribution by *The James Fund* allowed the BCGSC to use their expertise in genomics & DNA sequencing *"to identify therapeutic targets in high-risk Neuroblastoma"*.

About the BC Genome Sciences Centre:

Led by Dr. Marco Marra, they were the 1st in the world to sequence the SARS virus, and be established as a Canadian & world leader in DNA sequencing research. New-generation sequencing technology called Illumina dramatically reduces sequencing cost while improving its throughput. This technology at BCGSC can determine the DNA sequence of all genes in a cancer cell and detect their expression levels at the same time.

Statement of Purpose of the (BCGSC): *"To identify therapeutic targets in high-risk Neuroblastoma."*

The BCGSC collaborated on two projects with Neuroblastoma experts at the Hospital for Sick Children (Toronto), & the Children's Hospital's of Philadelphia & Los Angeles. These collaborations would not have been possible without the generous

donation from BCCCPA that enabled us to work on specialized Neuroblastoma research at the BCGSC. **Update of collaborations with other Centers:**

Early results from our sequencing experiments found that Neuroblastoma "queen bee" cells from bone marrow metastasis of Sick Kids patients expressed B-cell markers, normally found in leukemia and lymphoma cancers. These cells are thought to escape current therapies and contribute to tumor relapse. The potential clinical impact of finding the B-cell markers is significant, since it may suggest the use of existing leukemia and lymphoma drugs for treating metastatic Neuroblastoma in children.

Look for our announcement later this year of BCCCPA's next "Research Project" to be funded!



Megan McNeil's "Will to Survive" inspires families, survivors and donors.



January 28th, 2011 - Megan McNeil, 20, a singer who captured the hearts of North Americans with her song about what it's like to be a kid battling childhood cancer, passed away today. She had battled Adrenalcortical Carcinoma since she was 16. Megan wrote "The Will to Survive" to lift the spirits of other kids in the chemo ward.

Megan McNeil and her family know how hard the childhood cancer journey can be. And how lonely too. BCCCPA was there for the McNeils, as it has been for so many. And it hopes to be inspirational to others wherever they live, whose worlds have been turned upside down by childhood cancer. "Childhood cancer doesn't just affect the child. It affects the whole family and ripples out through whole communities. And yet research into childhood cancers are woefully underfunded, and support for families is woefully inadequate. We know. Because we've been there. And we are determined to walk beside those who will let us." (Megan's parents - Dave & Suzanne McNeil)

"Our daughter was our hero. She taught us the meaning of bravery and inspired us every day with her own Will to Survive. She wrote her song as a gift to anyone who needed to be picked up on a very bad day. And when you are a family fighting childhood cancer, there are a lot of very bad days. We are so grateful for the many who have reached out to let us know how much her song meant to them. And we are so glad she was, and is, our daughter."

Megan McNeil's "The Will to Survive" captured hearts across North America & gave hope to many.

When legendary music producer Garth Richardson (Hedley, Red Hot Chili Peppers, KISS) heard Megan's song, he knew he had to produce it, and a campaign to raise awareness to fight Childhood Cancer was born. Canada AM selected Megan's story one of the best of 2010 and CBC's Connect with Mark Kelley selected it as the most inspirational story of the year. Tens of millions of people throughout Canada and the US learned more about childhood cancer thanks to Megan's song and media campaign. News features about her story appeared as far away as England and Russia.

Megan considered it her personal mission to tell the world how terribly underfunded research is into childhood cancer. She also wanted everyone to know that research into adult cancers does not do much to help kids, but research into childhood cancers helps everyone, including adults.

Proceeds from "The Will to Survive" go to Childhood Cancers Groups including BCCCPA.

The team at BCCCPA, The Starlight Children's Foundation and the Coast to Coast Against Cancer Foundation invited businesses, students, friends and families to participate in The Inside Ride, Canada's first organized stationary cycling challenge/celebration and fundraising event dedicated to raising funds for local children's cancer charities supporting survivorship & quality of life in our community. Presented by the Coast to Coast Against Cancer Foundation, donations raised support for pediatric oncology and family funding programs.



Natures Corner ~ Things that make me feel better:



Chicken Soup for the "Healthy" Soul & more...

Mankind has been caring for its young since the beginning of time. Nature created us to survive. The more educated and technologically advanced we become the more we understand that many of our grandmothers "wise tales" are grounded in logic. Chicken noodle soup is filled with salt. The salt damages the walls of bacteria in your mouth and throat. Salt makes you thirsty. Water flushes poison and toxins from your system. Ten milliliters of chicken noodle soup by tea spoon, syringe or medicine cup every ten minutes for an hour can soothe a non-functioning gut and encourage it to start working again.

The human voice spoken one foot away from the incubator of a 27 week premature infant can cause it to stop breathing. (It takes too much energy to assimilate noise pollution and still have enough energy left over to breathe.) To conserve your child's energy when nauseated turn off the noise, turn down the lights, lay them as horizontal as possible. The less energy we use to assimilate our environment the more we have available for our body to repair and heal our cells.

Soothing Peppermint:

A cool cloth to the brow or inhaling peppermint can soothe away nausea. Peppermint foot spray from the Body Shop is available in a convenient bottle to spray on a cold cloth or dry tissue to breathe when traveling or in bed. Peppermint tea is cooling, soothing and aids digestion. Children often prefer the spearmint gum over drinking the tea, with the same benefits.

Cleanliness is next to... "Healthiness"?

Skin is the largest organ of our body. It protects us from infection and eliminates toxins. A daily bath can do wonders. Even a child who is too weak to walk or play will move the joints through the range of motion in a warm bath. Movement decreases pain. Heat from the water relaxes tense muscles and stimulates blood circulation. As muscles contract and relax to move our limbs it causes extracellular fluid to be pushed back into our bloodstream so we can excrete the toxic wastes in our urine.

Soap is abrasive and damages our skins natural oils. Immediately before disinfect the tub, rinse with clean water. Use one drop of baby oil in the water to eliminate the need for lotions which can clog skin pores. Wrap your child in a warm towel from the dryer. Pat dry or rub your hand against the towel, do not rub a towel on fragile skin. An old necklace or shoe lace can be used to pin the CVC or lines during a bath. A daily bath is a lot of work but can yield up to four hours of restful sleep allowing the body much needed time to rejuvenate and repair.



Don't be too hasty to throw out grandma's secret recipe or forget the arsenal of tools Mother Nature gifted us. You too are a wealth of knowledge in the art of healing. Look back to a time before medicine and remember what worked for your family in the past.

Though we (as children) had grown up with pets; in a household where Quinn's older sisters had dance, singing lessons about 6 days a week and we were battling his cancer, we couldn't devote the time, attention & energy that a pet deserves and needs. Yet, he kept asking. So we somewhat caved in... “Yes”, I said, “We'll get some fish.” “You don't have to walk it, pick up it's poop or get shots from the vet - it's a great, low maintenance pet.” Now Quinn, being a very smart 7 yr old, said “That's logical... and I get a pet.” So, that Saturday, we went to the local pet store and walked into the “Cave” of fish. (A term we came up with for the separate area within the pet store that was dimly lit - dark - and had about a hundred fish tanks.)

Upon entry, we noticed a single, huge tank to the left. It was about 4 feet long, 18” wide and 2 feet deep - with hundreds of little fish. The sign on it's front said “Feeder Fish”. Quinn asked, “Dad, what are Feeder Fish?” I said “ They're a cheap, sickly, wimpy kind of Goldfish that are used as live food for very large fish tanks with large fish in them, as they don't bother with the little cans of fish food flakes, they use these live fish.” He shrugged his shoulders as if to acknowledge the “cycle of life” and the reality of feeding larger fish. He was okay with that.

After 20 minutes of looking at the variety of fish to pick from, we stopped in front of a tank with some fairly large Goldfish and decided this is the type he wants. An employee asked if we needed help. “Yes,” I said while pointing. “My son would like to get a couple of those fish.” “How big is the tank?” asked the employee. With my hands I motioned and said “It's about 12” long, 8” deep and 10” high - that he got from a friend.”

“Oh No”, says the employee, “That's much too small for two of these fish, but just one would be alright.” Quinn had a slight look of shock on his face. “Oh No”, I said “He needs to have two in the tank. The fish needs a buddy to play with, so he won't get bored.”

I gave Quinn a Toonie, he handed it to the clerk and showed the baggie of two fish, and she handed him his change and a Membership card.




